## God at Work

### **Increase Cultivated Farmland**

Hope and Care for Children has over 400 acres of fertile land, providing food for the HCC children, and income for the ministry. HCC raises bees and cultivates oil palms, rice, avocados, bananas, and pineapples.

It's our hope and prayer that we can be The Light wherever God leads us in ministry. Two years after acquiring the 400 acres of farmland in an extremely remote part of Liberia, Hope and Care was able to re-open a defunct public school. Now, over 100 students attend a Lutheran school.

Many of these children would never have had the chance to receive an education. The joy and gratitude they express is truly indescribable. We are immensely grateful to be able to share with them the message of Jesus' love for them and their entire village.

#### **Tuition Assistance**

50% of kids in Liberia will not complete the 6th grade due to economic hardship or pressing needs by the family to put the child to work. Tuition assistance is provided annually to 600 students in three Lutheran Schools. God is breaking the chain of illiteracy in Jesus' Name.

### Rescuing At-Risk Children

Keeping children in the home with familial structure is always our goal. But in desperate situations, we offer the Hope Homes as a safe, nurturing option to raise such children. All kids have access to healthcare, nutritious meals, education and hope for a future.

### African Radio Ministries - ARM

ARM shares the Gospel in Ethiopia, Liberia, and Ivory Coast through Lutheran worship services on the radio.

The programs are designed to encourage listening groups that eventually become church plants, especially in remote, outlying areas where it would be difficult to support a pastor.
